HISTORIC PRESERVATION AWARD
Procedure and Criteria

Background:

The Jefferson Historic Preservation Award program is established to increase public awareness of Jefferson's historical heritage by recognizing structures and sites of historical significance. Recognition will be given to owners who have demonstrated outstanding commitment to excellence in their historic preservation efforts.

The periodic award is in recognition of outstanding preservation, restoration, or rehabilitation effort.

Selection:

The Landmarks Advisory Commission (LAC) will select the recipients.

Criteria applied to all structures and sites:

1. Must be located within Jefferson city limits
2. Must be at least 100 years old
3. Must meet five or more of the following:
 - a. Represent historic preservation accuracy
 - b. Guided by adaptive reuse
 - c. Considers preservation stewardship
 - d. Demonstrate restoration and rehabilitation
 - e. Promote a continuing link to the community's heritage
 - f. Possess artistic or aesthetic value
 - g. Be an iconic property
 - h. Have a record of significant historical or economic contribution to the community
 - i. Advance local cultural heritage
 - j. Have proven historic provenance


LAC Historic Preservation Award

4. Recipient will receive:
 - a. City Council recognition
 - b. A permanent sign or plaque to be installed by the recipient that shall be visible from the street
 - c. A semi-permanent sign to be displayed on the premises until transferred to the next recipient
 - d. Public recognition via on-line and print media
5. The recipient must sign a Photo Release.
